Aidmatrix Foundation, Inc

Aidmatrix is working diligently with our global NGO and local partners in Haiti to connect the various response efforts for the recent earthquake. Needs for In-Kind and Transportation donations are currently being assessed and will be posted to the Aidmatrix Network as they become available.

American Red Cross

Locating Family Members in Haiti

As a result of the earthquake that hit Haiti on 12 January 2010, thousands of persons within Haiti and abroad have lost contact with their loved ones. The aim of the Family Links website is to accelerate the process of restoring contact between separated family members. It is managed by the ICRC, in cooperation with the tracing services of the Haitian Red Cross Society and of National Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies throughout the world. At this stage, the website offers the possibility for persons in Haiti and abroad to register the names of relatives with whom they are striving to restore contact. It will progressively incorporate information offering responses to those queries.

Disaster Relief

The American Red Cross is sending money, supplies and staff to Haiti to support relief efforts there after yesterday's earthquake, which caused catastrophic damage and loss of life. According to reports, as many as three million people may have been affected by the quake, which collapsed government buildings and caused major damage to hospitals in the area. The Red Cross is contributing an initial \$1 million from the International Response Fund to support the relief operation, and has opened its warehouse in Panama to provide tarps, mosquito nets and cooking sets for approximately 5,000 families. In addition to Red Cross staff already in Haiti, six disaster management specialists are being deployed to the disaster zone to help coordinate relief efforts. At this time, the American Red Cross is only deploying volunteers specially trained to manage international emergency operations.

Catholic Charities of Florida, Inc

Catholic Charities of Florida is mobilizing to respond to the situation in Haiti. The Archbishop has authorized an assessment team of four to travel and we are currently seeking emergency arrangements to travel to Haiti immediately - ASAP. The Team would be headed by Rev. Dr. Richard Turcotte, Catholic Charities of Miami.

Christian Contractors Association, Inc

Established communications with a local ministry that we have worked with in the past who has contacts in the area about 30 miles inland of Port-Au-Prince; I'm not sure what we can do for them at this time other than prayer. Free up some warehouse space in our building if needed.

Christian Disaster Response

Christian Disaster Response and our Partner Agencies that make up The Global Disaster Response Network have already responded to Haiti. Four of our Partners are located in Florida. Food, water purification equipment, medical supplies are in transit. Medical teams will be sent as soon as supply line and support are in place. Our second network conference call will take place as soon as we hear from our team in Haiti.

Church of Scientology Disaster Relief Team

Definitely going to be sending people to help from here in Florida and from other areas as well.

Compassion Alliance

Making arrangements to send a number of containers to Haiti. We have 25 containers of bottled water to send which adds up to about 500,000 bottles of water and also 40,000 pounds of canned vegetables. We are also wanting to send the personal cleaning systems.

Convoy of Hope

Convoy of Hope has been on the ground prior to this event for a number of years with feeding programs serving about 7000 kids a day and we have a team there now. We have been in contact with them in Port Au Prince and they are working to feed and give water from our warehouse there. We are working today to get other teams deployed first thing Thursday am and will update as that is available. As an ESF 15 Support Agency to the State of Florida we have been in contact with them in support of any plans they have for their operations.

The Eagles Wings Foundation

EWf has a small team ready to deploy immediately to Haiti from WPB - access is the issue. I just met with two of the team, one of whom grew up in Haiti and has lots of family there plus has talked to one of them this morning. He is fluent in Creole and has bilingual relatives there. The other team member ready to go is fluent in Spanish and goes way back with me plus is a heavy equipment operator. A fourth is tied to leadership in major church organization. Given my own 9 weeks in Haiti plus this small unit, I might suggest we could assist as a point team for that which we have done on major disasters before. Units are self supporting. Need a way to access the area. We have all been trained and have been in major devastated areas before, including the reminder that our unit was named the Incident Commander by the Bahamian Prime Minister for the first 14 days following Cat 5 Floyd, maneuvering around tricky international issues. Humanitarian side - coordinating local volunteers down there in such a way which we have done many times - relying upon our own team's local family connections already there. Please consider this request to work with you. Add in from our communications guru - our team has 10 portable HAM radios with a base station.

Recall also our 100 cell phones are designed to work with no cell towers at all and could have Creole questions programmed into them promptly - though clearly data collection is not the highest priority.

Feed The Children

Mission Harvest America, Inc. will begin collecting food and medical supplies for relief efforts in Haiti Wednesday in response to the Earthquake which occurred earlier today. Dry food, bags of rice or beans, powered milk; first aid items are all needed. No box or package type foods please due to damage in handling. Donated materials will be placed in large fiber barrels and stage on a container for immediate shipment to Haiti. Due to the damages at Port au Prince we will ship relief supplies to St. Marc until we know Port au Prince Port is accessible and distribution can occur. St. Marc is only 60 miles from Port au Prince. Funds are needed to cover the cost of shipping, handling and sending relief personnel to Haiti. Florida Baptist Disaster Relief

Working with Samaritan's Purse to get 2 people on one of their charter flight Saturday. We still would like to keep any FEMA or Military transport options open if they become available.

The Florida Baptist Convention conducts regular work in Haiti and will respond in some way yet to be determined. We have a mission house that is located about 17 miles from the epicenter. We have not been able to contact our staff (Haitian Nationals) at this time but will continue to do so. In past disasters (hurricanes & floods) we have helped by providing food (rice & beans) that is distributed to communities through our partner churches. We have also provided clothing and other supplies (2008 Ike we distributed over 50 tons of rice across the country). Distributing rice through our churches guarantees that the rice gets to the people and not the black market. Our response is coordinated through our Partnership department. My office will work with them. They are making plans to travel to Haiti as we type. We will also work with our partners: Baptist Global Response (Southern Baptist International Disaster NGO) and North American Mission Board.

Florida Crisis Response Team

The Florida Crisis Response Team would be able to assemble a Crisis Response Team to provide crisis intervention and emotional support. However, funding for this endeavor would be essential in order for us to provide needed assistance. Unfortunately, without a source to cover our costs, we would be unable to help.

Florida Goodwill Association

Goodwill will take donation of material items and convert them into cash or goods for the victims if you wish. To do so we will need to have a coordinated state wide effort. We would ask for donations, measure the donations and convert them into cash or goods. Let me know if this is wanted or needed.

Lutheran Services Florida

Our response will come from the National Lutheran Church Bodies.

Nightrunners

Night Runners is currently planning to ship a mobile medical unit equipped with examining tables and supplies to Haiti via the Dominican Republic. In the process of requesting financial assistance for shipping, purchasing 2 generators and batteries that will go with the mobile medical unit. The Salvation Army

Salvation Army personnel from Florida are traveling along with other members of a delegation to Haiti today (Jan. 13) to help aid residents in the wake of the deadly 7.0 earthquake that hit Tuesday afternoon. Three Salvation Army officers (pastors) from South Florida and one Salvation Army employee from Tampa are expected to fly out of Fort Lauderdale International Airport this afternoon, with arrival into a small regional airport near Port-au-Prince later this afternoon or tonight. Salvation Army personnel are carrying extra generators, satellite phones and other supplies for the trip.

This deployment is expected to one of several out of Florida to Haiti. The Salvation Army has been stationed in Haiti since 1950 and operates a children's home, primary and secondary schools and a hospital. All Salvation Army staff in Haiti are accounted for, but property has been badly damaged.

Salvation Army officers and staff will focus primarily on the immediate needs of disaster survivors and first-responders, providing food, hydration and shelter for impacted individuals and families.
